

Beethoven's only concerto for violin is an exquisite musical composition featuring David McCarroll, a Sonoma County native, and Concertmaster of the Pittsburgh Symphony. Copland's Fanfare for the Common Man is a tribute to the strength and resilience of ordinary people. Lincoln Portrait, narrated by the host of public radio's Marketplace, Kai Ryssdal, reflects on the legacy of Abraham Lincoln.

With its grandeur and breathtaking melodies, Mahler's revered masterpiece Resurrection ignited his lifelong exploration of the beauty of the afterlife.


