Opera in Concert: Mozart's *The Magic Flute*A unique collaboration with ArtQuest of Santa Rosa High School
April 15, 2023, at Weill Hall, Green Music Center

(Santa Rosa, Calif.) — Santa Rosa Symphony (SRS) presents Opera in Concert: Mozart's *The Magic Flute*, on April 15, 2023 at 7:30 pm, Weill Hall, Green Music Center, in conjunction with ArtQuest at Santa Rosa High School. Professional Bay Area Opera singers and San Francisco Conservatory of Music student singers will share the stage with the SRS orchestra and the ArtQuest chorus, dancers, and narrators for a concert version of Mozart's most popular opera. ArtQuest is a public-school magnet program for the Visual and Performing Arts at SRHS. The SRS last performed a production of this type 20 years ago when they presented Tippett's, *Child of Our Time*.

The colorful and engaging music of *The Magic Flute* encompasses all the elements of a good fairytale with rich characters, beautifully drawn by Mozart's music. Life-size sculptures of the *Magic Flute* characters, designed and created by ArtQuest students, will be on full display in the Green Music Center's courtyard, and instrumental music students will be performing in the lobby before the concert. All eight ArtQuest specialties are participating, from performing and creating visual works to documenting this unique collaboration through Photography, Video and Digital Arts.

ABOUT SANTA ROSA SYMPHONY

Santa Rosa Symphony, the Resident Orchestra of the Green Music Center, is the third-oldest professional orchestra in California, and the largest regional symphony north of Los Angeles. Francesco Lecce-Chong, the Symphony's fifth music director in its 95 years, began his tenure in 2018. Alan Silow, President & CEO, began his tenure in 2002. The Symphony is committed to the core values of artistic excellence, innovative programming, comprehensive music education and community service.

The Symphony's performance schedule includes 21 Classical Series concerts (seven sets), seven Discovery Dress Rehearsal concerts, a three-concert Family Series and a four-concert Pops Series, as well as special concerts.

Awards include an American Symphony Orchestra League MetLife Award for Community Engagement and a first-place award for adventurous programming in the 2012-2013 season from the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers.

The Symphony is recognized as having one of California's most comprehensive music education programs, serving nearly 20,000 youths annually. Collaborations with schools and organizations across Sonoma County have gained the Santa Rosa Symphony national attention and support.
